**‘SAVE SCC’ GROUP TO HOLD ‘CRUCIAL’ INFORMATIONAL MEETING  
WEDNESDAY, APRIL 22, 2026 AT COMMUNITY HALL**

**Important Issues To Be Discussed: ‘Activity’ on North Lakes Golf Course;  
Zoning and Land Use Concerns; Q&A with Hillsborough County’s Adam Gormly**

Sun City Center, FL (April 4, 2026) – Save Sun City Center (Save SCC) has scheduled a “crucially important” informational meeting for residents of the community that will include several topics, including “activity” reported on the North Lakes Golf Course, possible options to prevail against development with zoning and land use laws, and the Greater Sun City Community Plan adopted in November 2010 by the Board of Hillsborough County Commissioners, and other topics.

The Save SCC meeting will be held at 5 p.m. on April 22 in the Community Hall, 1910 S. Pebble Beach Blvd., in Sun City Center. Save SCC representatives will be present at 4 p.m. to address any specific concerns or pre-meeting questions, as well as provide Save SCC promotional materials for a donation.

In addition, Adam Gormly, Department Director for Hillsborough County’s Development Services, has committed to attend the meeting to answer questions from the audience.

Among key recent concerns, says the organization, are reports by residents near the North Lakes Golf Course that they have seen contractors conducting soil testing on the golf course, as well as others doing land surveying. The North Lakes course is one of five closed golf courses owned by ClubLink and targeted for possible rezoning and development.

"These reports from our North Lakes neighbors are a major wake-up call," said Ellie Anderson, president of Save SCC, the grassroots 501(c)(3) organization. "These reports show ClubLink is getting serious about building on the golf courses that are closed, and we have to be ready to fight. With Hillsborough County's Adam Gormly joining us for this meeting, this is our chance to get answers, unite, and work our plans to maintain and to protect our community's character and golf courses for future recreational use only."

ClubLink first announced its intentions and tentative plans for its residential development for Sun City Center golf course properties four years ago. The Canadian company now has five of the seven golf courses it owns in the Greater Sun City Area closed, including two courses in Kings Point and three courses in Sun City Center. Since its presentation to the community in March 2022, ClubLink has not communicated about its future intentions to the community. However, ClubLink's 2025 Annual Report states: "The Company is considering development options for its underutilized land in Sun City."

"As always, there is a lot to be done as we prepare for ClubLink's next move, and we want to keep everyone informed, up to speed and working our plans as we prepare for ClubLink's eventual filings for development permits."
